FIRE PREVENTION NEWS

HOME FIRES KILL CHILDREN

There have been heart-breaking stories lately on the radio about the great loss of life in Ontario. Today there was a report of a fire in the city of Montreal, a mother and her three children lost their lives in the fire. It is not the purpose of this write-up to deal with the deplorable loss of adult life which has been involved but of the horrifying fact that so many helpless children are burned or hurt. The number of children who have had to be rescued or have escaped by their own efforts is grimly impressive of the ever-present danger.

Newspapers and Radios disclose the fact that since the beginning of the year, 1955, there have been fires in Ontario in which fifty children are mentioned as having been involved in one way or another. Doubtless they were involved in other fires which no mention is made on the Radio or in the newspapers.

This record concerns children only and it would have been worse had it not been for heroic rescuers. Some of whom burned in saving the lives of children. These were taken to safety by people of all ages, by a boy of 16, by parents, by a Grand-father, and by other relatives and in some cases by good neighbours. Some mothers dropped their children from windows to people below or dropped themselves carrying a child.

In Winter the snow facilitates such escapes. It is in Winter that most fires

are caused, winter temperatures that result in trouble with faulty heating, over-heated pipes, chimney fires, and so on.

A number of the fires appear to have originated in closets. Unquenched cigarettes are a perpetual menace but it was not specifically blamed in the accounts given of any of these fires. But wherever the blame may lie, children lost their lives in Ontario fires. It is a heart-breaking record ~~we~~ we should not let it happen in Terrace Bay.
