

RECIPE OF THE WEEK CHEESE SOUFFLE

3 tbs. butter or margarine

3 tbs. flour

1/2 tsp. salt Few grains pepper

1/4 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

egg whites dash tabasco

3/4 cup milk

1-1/2 cups grated American cheese

4 egg yolks

Melt butter or margarine; blend in flour, salt, pepper, Worcestershire sauce and tabasco. Gradually add milk. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly, until thick. Add cheese. Beat egg yolks: add. Cool. Beat egg whites stiff, but not dry; fold in. Pour into greased baking dish. Bake in moderate oven (325°F.) 1 hour. Serve immediately.
