BARBECUED HAMBURGER SANDWICHES

- 1 pound ground beef
1 medium onion, chopped
1/4 cup chopped green pepper
1/4 teaspoon chili powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
1 can (8 ounces) tomato sauce
1/4 cup water
6 sandwich rolls, split and buttered
- Shape beef into 6 patties. Brown quickly on both sides in hot skillet. Remove patties, and pour off most of fat. Add onion and green pepper, and cook 3 or 4 minutes. Add patties and remaining ingredients, except rolls; simmer 10 minutes. Toast rolls in broiler. Serve with patties and sauce. Makes 6 sandwiches.
