There was a public school principal's conference here last Tuesday and Wednesday.

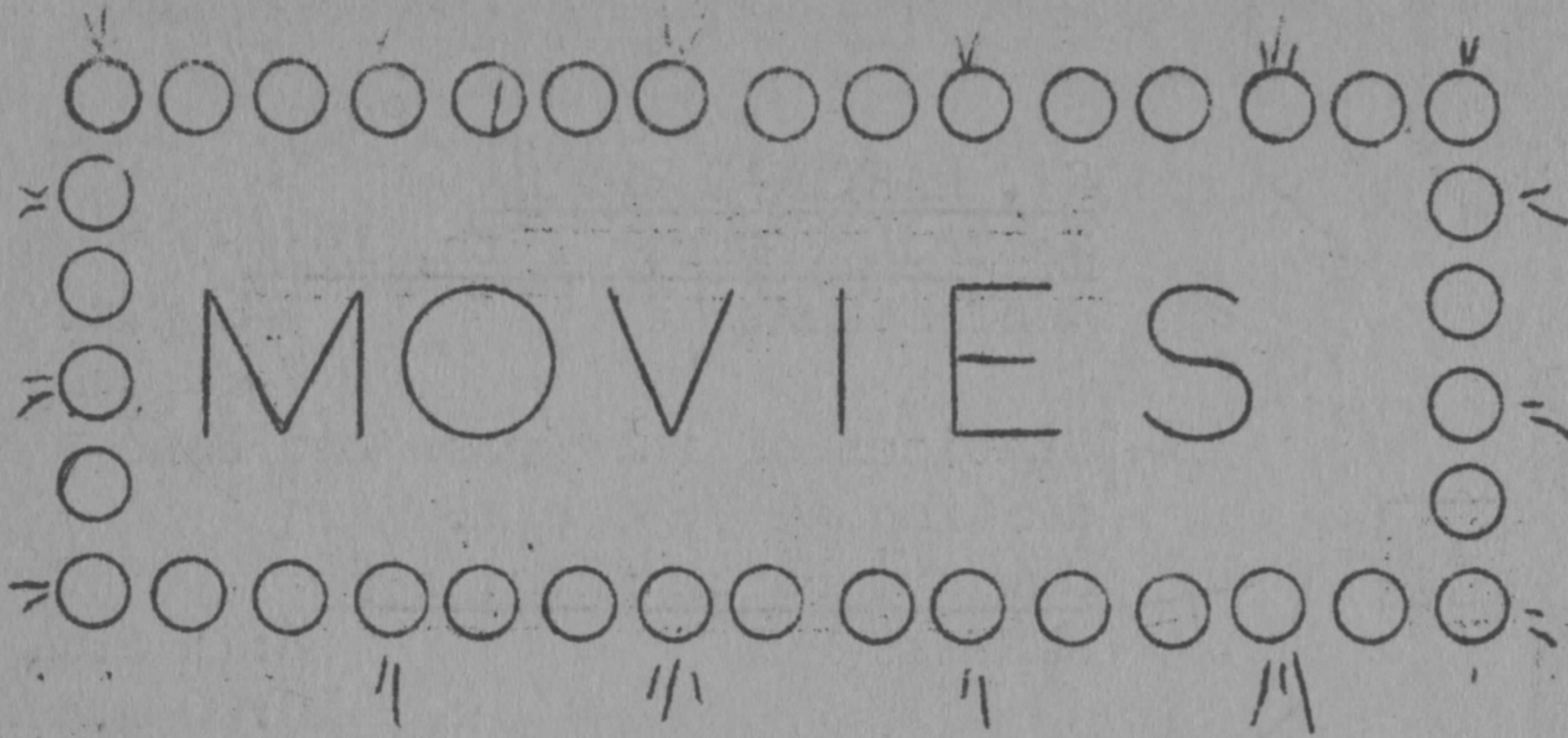
