FILMS

MATTER OF IMPORTANCE - Color-17 min.
If you are tired of working for money, if you would like money to work for you, then you may get some ideas from this film story of a young couple who made a surprising discovery. Presented by an association of investment dealers, this film shows that anyone with a modest budget for savings might do well to seek advice and begin an investment portfolio.

THE MAGIC ENVELOPE - Color - 17 min.
A guide to skin care, showing how your skin helps to maintain the health of the body, and what to do when soap and water fail to keep it clean. The microscope and camera combine in this film to probe below the surface of the skin to show how the more common blemishes such as pimples and chafing are caused and cured. The film was sponsored by a manufacturer of skin cream.

STRIKE IN TOWN - B&W - 38 min.
A candid presentation of what is involved when the boss and workers fail to agree about wages and working conditions. Made in a town where loss of employment would halt the community's economic life, the film shows how the threat of a strike affects the boss, the workers and the people on the sidelines. An engrossing subject, this story is presented with sympathy, humour and respect for all points of view.
