



RECIPE OF THE WEEK  
MAGIC MOCHA RUDDING

- 3 ounces (3 squares) unsweetened chocolate  
 1-1/2 tbsp. corn starch  
 2 cups fine granulated sugar  
 2-1/2 cups water  
 1-1/2 cups once-sifted cake flour  
 2-1/2 tsps. Baking Powder  
 1/2 tsp. salt  
 2 tsps. powdered instant coffee  
 6 tbsps. butter or margarine  
 1 egg, well-beaten  
 1/3 cup milk  
 1/2 tsp. vanilla

Melt the chocolate in the top of double boiler. Combine the corn starch and 1-1/2 cups of the sugar and stir into melted chocolate. Stir in water. Cook over low direct heat, stirring constantly, until sauce comes to the boil; cover and keep hot over boiling water until needed.

Grease a 6-cup casserole. Preheat oven to 350° (moderate).

Sift flour, Baking powder, salt and instant coffee together three times. Cream butter or margarine; gradually blend in remaining 1/2 cup sugar. Add well-beaten egg, part at a time, beating well after each addition. Measure milk and add vanilla. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture about a third at a time, alternating with two additions of milk and vanilla and combining lightly after each addition. Turn batter into prepared casserole. Pour 2 cups of hot chocolate sauce over batter. (Keep remaining sauce over hot water to serve with pudding.) Bake pudding in preheated oven about 50 minutes. Pass remaining hot sauce.
