LIBRARY NEWSBoon Island - Kenneth Roberts

Boon Island is a boulder strewn ledge off the coast of southern Maine. In the winter of 1710 the ship Nottingham, 135 days out of Greenwich ran aground this island during a northeastern gale. The shipwrecked men stubbornly clung to life although they had neither food, fire or tools. With a few scattered pieces of driftwood, sails and cordage they fought death on this icecovered rock.

Mr. Roberts description, at the beginning of his novel brings alive the gaiety and charm of 18th century England.

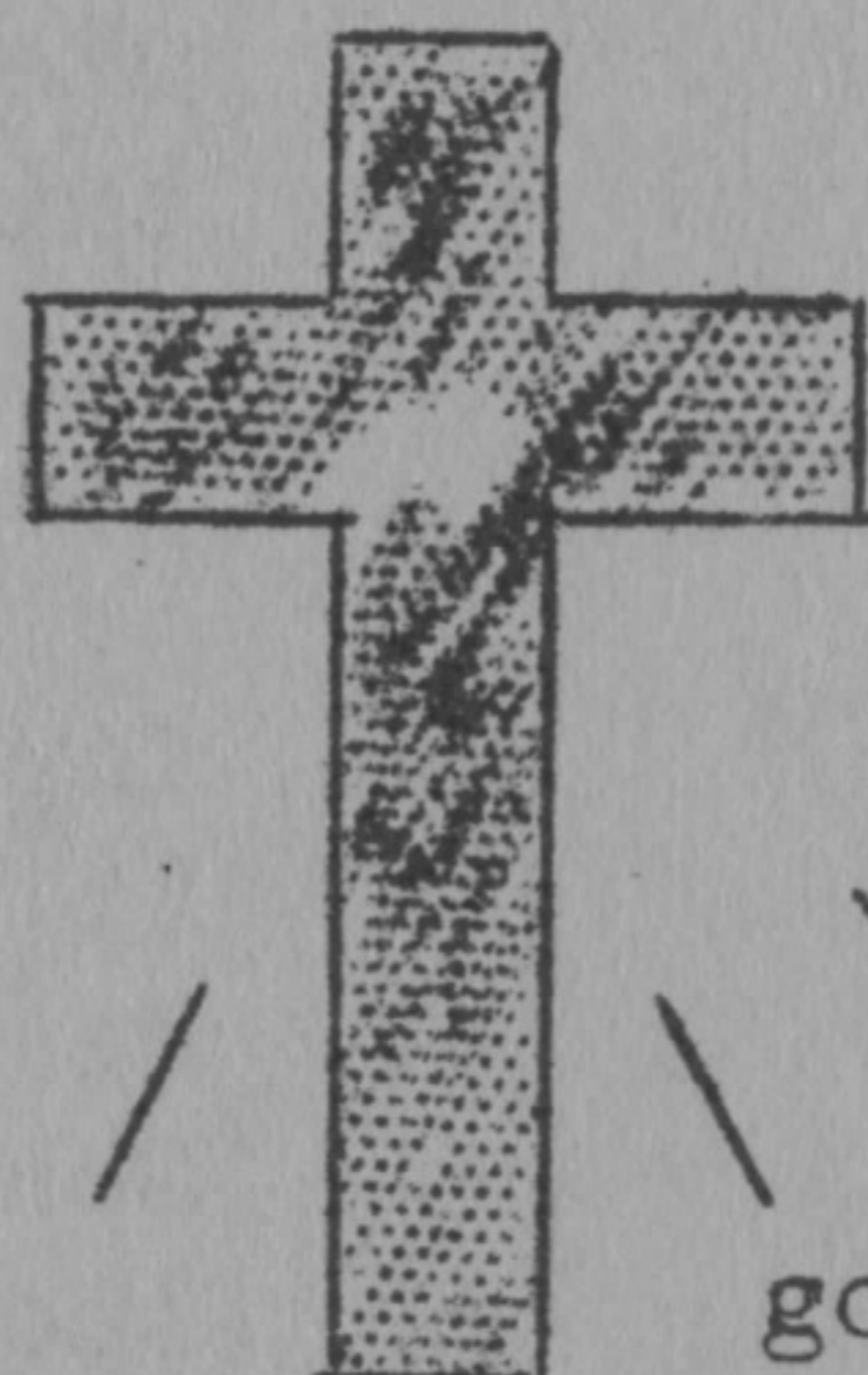
