



RECIPE OF THE WEEK
LEMON CREAM PIE

Prepare 1 9-inch pie shell

Combine in sauce pan:

3 cups milk
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup sugar
3 egg yolks, slightly beaten
1 tablespoon butter

Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly for 10 minutes. Stir together:

1 cup additional milk
2/3 cup cornstarch

Add to hot liquid, and cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until mixture is very thick. Remove from heat. Add gradually, stirring rapidly:

strained juice from 2 lemons.

Stir until blended. Turn into cooled, baked pie shell. Top with meringue immediately! Place in a bowl:

3 egg whites
dash of salt

Beat until foamy. Add gradually:

6 tablespoons sugar

Beat while adding, and continue to beat until mixture stands in smooth, firm peaks. Spread on pie, right to the crust edge. Let stand for 5 minutes so meringue will start cooking from underneath. Bake in hot oven (400-425 F.) for about 8 minutes, or until as brown as desired. Cool away from draft. Place in cool place to set.
