TO THE RESIDENTS OF TERRACE BAY:

On June 5th and 6th the Ontario Department of Health and the local Tuberculosis Association are bringing a railway X-ray car to Terrace Bay.

The car will be spotted at the mill and a portable unit will be set up in the Recreation Centre.

The importance of bringing the X-ray unit here cannot be over emphasized. It is important to find out about tuberculosis early. Early tuberculosis has no warning signals. Persons have it and infect others before they know they are ill.

A periodic chest X-ray shows up the disease in its early stages. It is most important that everyone over 12 have a chest X-ray when the unit visits here in June.

Further details and a survey form will be published in the Terrace Bay News in the next few weeks. M. O. Nelson and Alex MacDonald are the local representatives.
