

RECIPE OF THE WEEK
CARAMEL SPICE CAKE

cup brown sugar, packed
eggs

l/3 cup shortening (quick-mix)
teaspoon vanilla
cups sifted cake flour
cups sifted cake flour
teaspoons baking powder
teaspoon salt
teaspoon mace
teaspoon cinnamon
cup milk

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Line bottoms of two 8-inch round layer cake pans with waxed paper. Grease paper and sides of pans.

Measure into mixing bowl, the sugar eggs, shortening and vanilla. Beat for 3 minutes (medium speed on electric mixer).

Alternately add dry ingredients and milk, beating at low speed.

Divide batter between two prepared layer cake pans. Bake in moderate oven 25 to 30 minutes.

Cool in pans 5 minutes, then remove and complete cooling on cake rack.

When cold, frost with Butterscotch Frosting.
