D. C. PORTER APPOINTED MILL MANAGER; COOSA RIVER NEWSPRINT COMPANY.

The Kimberly-Clark Corporation of Neenah Wisconsin have announced that D. C. (Don) Porter, Mill Manager of the LongLac Pulp and Paper Company Limited at Terrace Bay, Ontario, will assume new responsibilities as Mill Manager of the Coosa River Newsprint Company at Coosa Pines, Alabama, effective May 16, 1956.

The Kimberly-Clark Corporation manages and operates the Coosa River Newsprint Company which currently is undergoing an-expansion program for the addition of a new newsprint machine.

Don Porter has been Mill Manager of the LongLac Pulp and Paper Company Limited since start-up of operations in 1948.

A native of Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin, Mr. Porter joined the Kimberly-Clark Corporation shortly after graduating from Marquette University in 1928. He had been Pulp Mill Superintendent at Kimberly, Wisconsin and was active on the Neenah Staff before coming to Terrace Bay.

(Joe) Wig came to Terrace Bay in February 1948 from Neenah, Wisconsin, as Plant Engineer. Joe graduated from Marquette University in 1939 and immediately joined the Kimberly-Clark Corporation.
