BADMINTON

Last year our badminton group enrollment was 35 members. As in the past, we have many good players belonging to this Club. Inter-town tournaments are played, as well as the play-off tournament, which takes in players from Marathon, Schreiber and Terrace Bay. Badminton players meet once a week and are a well-organized group.

In September of 1955, on the re-forming of the Club, the membership slipped down to 35 active members, but this activity is still being conducted satisfactorily to meet the needs of these players.
