GET YOUR BUSH TRAVEL PERMIT

This summer will see stricter control of bush travel in Ontario in view of last year's record of forest fires---2,247, of which 1,324 were caused by public carelessness and indifference to safety rules and warnings. The announcement was made by Hon. Clare E. Mapledoram, Minister of Lands and Forests, during a recent visit to the northern part of the Province.

As an important part of the fire prevention campaign, bush travel permits are again being issued by the Department without charge. They are being issued by rangers, tourist camp operators, sellers of fishing and hunting licences. Contrary to reports which reached
