

RECIPE OF THE WEEK ROSY FRUIT COBBLER

FRUIT SAUCE 1-1/4 cups sugar 2 tablespoons cornstarch 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves 1/2 cup orange juice 1/2 cup water tablespoons butter or margarine 1-1/2 pounds washed rhubarb, cut in 1-inch pieces. BISCUITS .2 cups sifted flour cup sugar (for dough) 1:/4 teaspoons baking powder teaspoon salt tablespoons shortening cup milk 2 : tablespoons sugar (for topping) Grated rind of 1 orange

Make FRUIT SAUCE: Blend sugar, cornstarch and cloves in large saucepan; stir in orange juice and water.

Bring to boiling, stirring constantly, until sugar dissolves; add butter or margarine and rhubarb; remove from heat.

Prepare BISCUITS: Measure flour, sugar (for dough), baking powder, and salt into sifter; sift into bowl.

Cut in shortening with pastry blender until mixture is crumbly.

Add milk; stir with fork just

until blended. (Dough will be soft)

Heat rhubarb mixture to boiling; pour into a large baking dish, 10-cup size; spoon biscuit topping in 8 mounds over top of fruit.

Combine sugar (for topping) and orange rind; sprinkle over biscuits.

Bake in hot oven (450°F) 25 minutes, or unti rhubarb is tender and biscuits are glistening brown. Serve warm with pour cream. STORK CLUB NEWS
