RECIPE OF THE WEEK

SPANISH LIVER

- 3 slices bacon
- 1 pound liver
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 cups thinly sliced onion
- 3/4 cup diced green pepper
- 1 No. 2 can (2-1/2 cups) tomatoes

Dice the bacon and fry until crisp.

Season the liver with salt and pepper, dredge with flour, if desired, and brown in the bacon fat; turn several times. Remove liver from the skillet; add the thinly sliced onions and green pepper, and cook until tender. Add tomatoes and liver. Cover; cook over low heat about 45 minutes. Uncover, increase heat, and evaporate the liquid until a consistency of a thick gravy; or add enough flour, if desired, to thicken the liquid slightly. Add salt and pepper to taste. Serves 5. It's the long, slow cooking that makes the liver so deliciously tender.
