RECIPE OF THE WEEK DAFFODIL CAKE eggs and erro eonsbredds edl 6 teaspoon Cream of tartar 1/2 tesspoon Vanilla 1/2 1-1/2 cups sugar 1-1/4 cups Cake flour 1/4 teaspoon salt teaspoon Baking powder 1/4 cup cold water 10 2 teaspoon lemon juice 1 teaspoon lemon rind, grated Separate egg whites from yolks; beat white foamy. Add cream of tartar; beat to soft moist peaks; add vanilla. Fold in 3/4 cup sugar, about 2 tablespoons at a time. Sift flour; measure 1/2 cup; add 1/8 teaspoon salt; sift again. Fold into egg whites, sifting in about 1/4 cup at a time. Beat egg yolks about 3 minutes; gradually beat in remaining 3/4 cup sugar. Sift flour, measure 3/4 cup; sift with baking powder remaining 1/8 teaspoon salt. Beat into yolk mixture alternately with water, lemon juice and rind. Spoon into ungreased 10-inch tube pan, alternating white and yellow mixtures. Bake in slow oven (325°) about 50 minutes. Invert pan to cool. serve with lemon whip cream. For lemon whip cream: Beat until stiff 1 cup heavy cream with 1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar, 2 teaspoons grated lemon rind.
