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WORKSHOP CAMP ON TEENAGE ACTIVITIES

A workshop camp on teenage activities will be held at the Duncan Memorial Camp, Loon Lake, from August 26th to September 1st, 1956, under the sponsorship of the Community Programmes Branch, Ontario Department of Education.
