LIBRARY NEWS

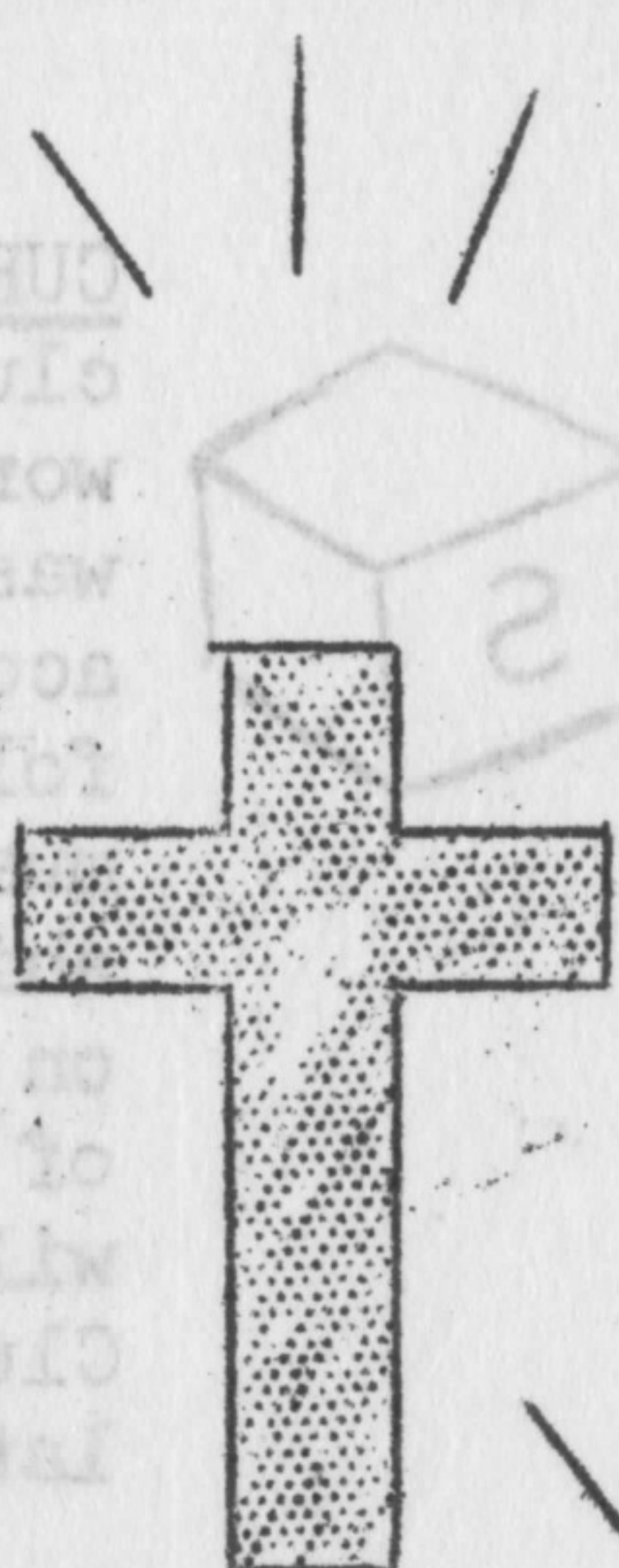
Haven's End - John P. Marquand
