CANADA SAVINGS BONDS ON SALE OCTOBER 15TH!!

Once again the Payroll Savings Plan will be available to all LongLac employees for the purchase of Canada Savings Bonds.

Last year 251 employees bought a total of \$80,250.00 Canada Savings Bonds. This year we have again asked a group of employees to act as volunteer canvassers. Within the next week these volunteer canvassers will be in contact with every employee, so would you think over your savings programme carefully during the next few days and take full advantage of this fine opportunity to buy Canada Savings Bonds the easy way.

This year the bond has thirteen coupons. The first covers a period of six months and the remaining twelve cover a one year period each. The first two coupons pay interest at the rate of 3-1/4% per year, the next two step up to 3-1/2%, the next two 3-3/4% and the last seven coupons pay 4%. This is an average yield of 3.76% through the life of the bond. As in all earlier series they may be redeemed at full face value plus earned interest at any time at any bank in Canada.
