HUNTING SAFETY

We continue to have hunting casualties every year; this year we have had two hunting accidents which hit close to home.

Every hunter then should find it timely to check the following hunting rules which are reprinted from the Lands and Forests magazine, "Sylva".

1. Treat every gun with respect due a loaded gun. This is the first rule of gun safety; guns carried into camp or home, or when otherwise not in use, must be unloaded.

2. Guns should always be carried in cases to the shooting area.

3. Always be sure gun or barrel are clear of obstruction, and that you have only ammunition of the proper size for the gun you are carrying; also remove grease from the chamber before firing.

4. Always carry your gun so that you can control the direction of the muzzle, even if you stumble.

5. Be sure of your target before you pull the trigger, and know the identifying features of the game you intend to hunt.
