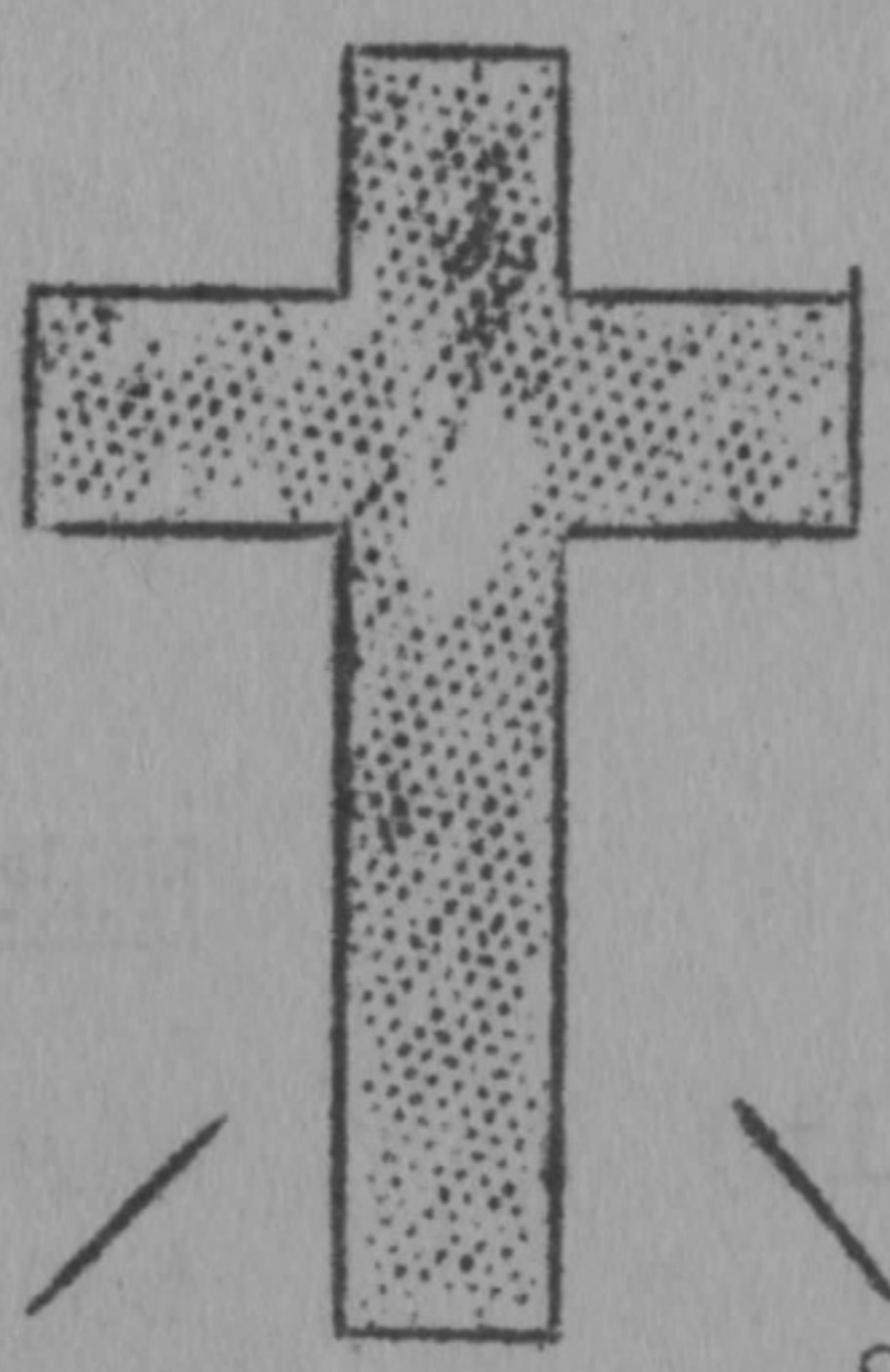

The Tribe That Lost Its Head - Nicholas Monsarrat

The Island of Pharamaul, on the south west coast of Africa had been a British Protectorate for over a hundred years. When the new Chief of the Maula tribe returned to his people after finishing his education at Oxford, he gave a careless interview to an unscrupulous reporter who like to "interpret" the news his own way. The whole world soon read that the new Maula Chief intended to marry a white woman. The handful of British administrators gradually found their control of the natives slipping as the obscene cult of the Fish again sprang to life. Mr. Monsarrat appears to have drawn a parallel between this story and the actual Mau Mau trouble in Africa. This is also an interesting and detailed account of the British colonial system.
