RECIPE OF THE WEEK  
CHOCOLATE CHIP CAKE

- 3/4 cup shortening
  - 1 cup sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla
  - 2 1-ounce squares unsweetened chocolate
  - 1 cup hot water
  - 1-3/4 cups enriched flour
  - 1/2 teaspoon salt
  - 1 teaspoon soda
  - 1 7- or 8-ounce package semi-sweet chocolate
  - 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- Thoroughly cream shortening and sugar; add eggs and vanilla; beat thoroughly. Melt chocolate in hot water over low heat; blend thoroughly. Cool slightly. Add to creamed mixture. Stir in the sifted dry ingredients. Pour into greased 7-1/2 by 12-inch cake pan. Sprinkle rows of cut chocolate or chocolate bits and nuts over batter. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 45 minutes. Sprinkle with sifted confectioners' sugar while warm.
