

RECIPE OF THE WEEK CHOCOLATE CHIP CAKE 3/4 cup shortening cup sugar eggs teaspoon vanilla 1-ounce squares unsweetened chocolate cup hot water 1-3/4 cups enriched flour 1/2 teaspoon salt teaspoon soda 7- or 8-ounce package semi-

sweet chocolate

cup chopped walnuts

Thoroughly cream shortening and sugar; add eggs and vanilla; beat thoroughly. Melt chocolate in hot water over dry ingredients. Pour into greased 7-1/2 by 12-inch cake pan. Sprinkle rows of cut chocolate or chocolate bits and nuts over batter. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 45 minutes. Sprinkle with sifted con fectioners' sugar while warm.
