

"KNOW THE ANSWER" - SAFETY CONTESTWEEKLY PRIZEGRAND PRIZE  
21" T.V. SET

1. Every LongLac employee, with the exception of the Contest Committee members, is eligible to participate in this contest subject to certain provisions noted below.
2. The contest will run for four months commencing January 1st, 1957 with contest finals at the conclusion of the four month period.
3. During each separate month of the contest there will be ten questions and answers published regularly in the Terrace Bay News pertaining to accident prevention.
4. Weekly for the 17 weeks of the contest a winner will be determined by the Safety Contest Committee based on these ground rules:
  - (a) Names will be chosen by a draw.
  - (b) Eligible will be any LongLac employee who has worked in a unit which has not had:
    - (1) A Doctor Care Case during the week prior to the draw or
    - (2) A Lost-time injury during a 30 day period prior to the draw.

Time to be calculated from the previous Saturday at Midnight.
5. Each week there will be one winner who has answered correctly a question selected by the Contest Committee from the questions and answers applying to the month concerned. The winner will receive a prize of his choice selected from prizes which will be displayed in the Safety Window. (Minimum Retail Value \$10.00)
6. At the conclusion of the 4-month contest during which there will be 17 winners, a Safety Rally will be held in the High School Auditorium. All 17 contestants will be eligible for a grand prize of a 21 inch T.V. set. Also, at the Rally two door prizes will be given away to people who attend, and chosen at random, can give the answer to a Safety question taken from the 40 listed in the

7. The quiz held at the Safety Rally will be based on the 40 questions used during the contest, plus other factors to be determined by the Safety Contest Committee.
8. In all cases of dispute, the final decision shall rest with the Safety Contest Committee.
