

what with injured players, thereby lessening their limited rosters. Replacements for injured players are not permitted in accordance with article 232 of the C.A.H.A. which reads "no replacement can be made for any ill or injured player except the goalkeeper".

Fortunately the regret felt by many with the withdrawal from the League by the Schreiber Colts was short-lived. Schreiber has been very active in hockey since 1934 and their sudden "going out of the picture", temporarily no doubt, was a heavy blow, not only to the Member Clubs of the N.S.H.L., but also to those many in Schreiber who put their "all" in keeping the franchise active. To single out one of the many in the last 23 years who have sacrificed of their time and money in promoting hockey in Schreiber would be unfair. It is hoped that the void felt will be a challenge to support the Schreiber Hockey Club.

Red Rock is a new entry in the League and play their games in the Nipigon Memorial Arena until their arena becomes ready. Thus far in the 90-game schedule average paid attendance in 51 games is 396 compared to 619 this time in last season's first 44 games. The lowest paid admissions is 117 in the Schreiber Arena compared to last season's low 264 in the Geraldton Arena. The highest paid admissions is 833 in the Marathon Arena compared to last season's high 1000 in the Nipigon Arena. Based on the current average attendance, all locales will have to be better in order to surpass last season's record paid admissions of 36,567 in the then 60-game schedule. The 14-game play-offs attracted 13,664 to swell the all time high of 50,231 in 74 games.

Records reveal that in 18 games Terrace Bay Superiors have played before 8143 paid admissions; Nipigon Flyers
