SUPERIORS TAKE 2 - 1 LEAD IN SEMI-FINALS -

On February 27, an accident occurred on a Terrace Bay street involving a child on a sleigh and a motorist. It is fortunate that the accident was not a serious one. But the occurrence of it emphasizes once again that in the winter months everyone has to be vigilant in order to avoid such accidents.

Driving in Terrace Bay in the winter months presents hazards. The snow banks along the roads are extremely high and if children play on them and suddenly slide on the road it is most difficult for a motorist to stop suddenly on the usually slippery surface to avoid an accident.
