

RECIPE OF THE WEEK
APRICOT REFRIGERATOR CAKE

1 Pkg. dried apricots (12 oz.)

2 cups water
1 cup butter

2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar

4 eggs, separated

Rind and juice of 1 lemon

1/3 cup granulated sugar 3 dozen ladyfingers

3/4 cup heavy cream, whipped

Toasted cocoanut

Stew apricots in water until tender and liquid is absorbed. Put through ricer or sieve (there will be about 1½ cups thick pulp), cool. Cream butter, add sugar and beat until light. Add egg yolks and beat well. Beat in apricot pulp, lemon rind and juice. Beat egg whites until stiff, gradually beat in granulated sugar. Fold in apricot mixture. Line deep 9" springform pan with split ladyfingers. Put in alternate layers of 1/3 of mixture and 1/3 of remaining ladyfingers. Chill overnight. Garnish with whipped cream and toasted cocoanut. Makes 10 to 12 servings.
