WATER SAFETY INSTRUCTORS COURSE TO BE HELD IN FORT WILLIAM

A swimming and water safety instructors' course for communities in Northwestern Ontario will be held at the Fort William Y. M. C. A. on Monday, April 22nd to Thursday, April 25th inclusive.

The course is sponsored by the Water Safety Service Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society, Ontario Division, in cooperation with the Lakehead Red Cross Branches and the Community Programmes Branch of the Ontario Department of Education.

Applications will be accepted from any community in Northwestern Ontario. Applicants should be 18 years of age and hold a life saving award. Persons who do not meet these prerequisites may register and may be admitted to the course, depending upon the number enrolled. There is no fee for the course, but the individual or sponsoring group is responsible for travel, room and board of the applicant.

Application forms are available at local Y. M. C. A.'s Recreation offices, or Red Cross offices. They are to be completed and returned by April 12, 1957, to the Community Programmes Branch, Ontario Department of Education, 400 Catherine St., Fort William, Ontario.
