CENOTAPH MEMORIAL

There is nothing like a "shot in the arm" for what ails you, and in effect the Cenotaph project received just this during the past week. While it is still too early to determine what extent or form this will take, we can rest assured it will be commensurate with the need. Probably, even more important is the Board's sincere desire to have the finished project measure up to the high standard of efficiency and appeal evident throughout our modern townsite.

Information has been received that a new building stone is now available on the market which lends itself admirably to Cenotaph construction. It is known as "Angel Stone" and features a pre-cut stone in varying lengths and widths, smooth on three sides with the front or outer side finished in a finely pebbled, silicon treated face. In addition this stone is available in a number of hues and colours such as Buff, grey, brown, rose, etc. Its durability and weathering properties are qualities which the manufacturer is inordinately proud of. With such potential it requires little or no imagination to visualize a brand new field of possibilities in the ultimate design of our Cenotaph.
