CENOTAPH MEMORIAL

Another significant development has come up in regard to the type of Cenotaph we may expect to have erected locally.

"Indiana Limestone" is the magic word. Alf. Barbini, here for Mill Shutdown work, advised his firm has available in the Lakehead a block of this stone sufficient to meet the requirements of the proposed Cenotaph. This would be erected in the traditional "Flanders Cross" form with an engraved sword pointed downward along the tree of the Cross. The Cross itself would rest on a 2 or 3 tiered base arrangement with the entire Memorial placed in the centre of a raised concrete apron - approximate height would be 12 feet.

The entire Cenotaph would appear in an off-shade of white - the natural colour of Indiana Limestone - and to prevent weathering, a silicon finish would be applied. This treatment, incidentally, is to stone as slick or varnish is to wood, and is applied just as easily and as effectively. Due to severe climate conditions we experience in this area this treatment should be repeated every 3 or 4 years - a job that can be completed in a matter of hours.

Scale drawings are to be submitted as soon as possible in order to allow the Remembrance Day Committee a first hand study of the possibilities of this type of Cenotaph.
