YOUTH CONFERENCE REPORT - JOAN HOPPER VOTED YOUTH RALLY BEAUTY QUEEN.

The Annual Northwestern Zone Youth Rally, held at Atikokan last weekend, was again a smash success. Largest of its kind in Canada, the Rally brought together teenagers from Marathon, Terrace Bay, Red Rock, Port Arthur, Fort William, Geraldton, Atikokan, Dryden, Emo, Sioux Lookout, Fort Frances, and other smaller centres.

Over 350 of these young delegates gathered to discuss mutual problems, exchange valuable ideas for teen town activities, and to lay constructive plans for better teenage programmes in the Northwestern Zone.

The local club, 20 strong and accompanied by the Recreation Director, travelled by bus with the Marathon group, leaving Terrace Bay at 11 a.m. Thursday and returning at 9:30 Sunday evening.

While in Atikokan, all delegates were billeted in private homes, where they enjoyed great hospitality. After a "get-acquainted" session on Thursday night, and a tour of the Steep Rock Iron Mines, on Friday morning, the delegates settled down to the purpose of the Rally, the discussions, which are listed below:

1. Know Yourself
2. The Aim of Education
3. Boy-Girl Relations
4. Teen Club Programs

In each case the subject was introduced by an adult authority, then the teenagers broke into groups for discussion, after which they reassembled to report their findings.

In addition to the discussion, there were dances on Friday and Saturday nights, and the teenagers put on a top flight floor show at the Saturday night gathering. This followed a banquet provided by the town of Atikokan.

Highlight of the social activities for the local teen town was the choosing of their own Joan Hopper as the 1957 Youth Rally Beauty Queen. Joan received a cup and a bouquet of rare white orchids from the judges, and a beautiful compact from the Terrace Bay Teen Town.

The Rally closed with non-denominational church services on Sunday morning, the end of a hectic but profitable Youth Rally.
