- PENNY FUSES BLAMED AS 2 DIE IN FIRE

St. Louis, April 11 -(AP)- Two boys burned to death when fire swept their home yesterday and Joseph Ahearn, fire battalion chief blamed pennies behind the fuses in the electrical system. Mrs. Birto Doss managed to rescue one son, Birto, Jr., 2 1/2, but flames and smoke drove her back when she tried to reach David, 20 months, and Eugene, seven months. The pennies in the fuse box let too much current flow into the electrical wiring, Ahearn said, and overheated wires set the house afire.
