LIBRARY REVIEW

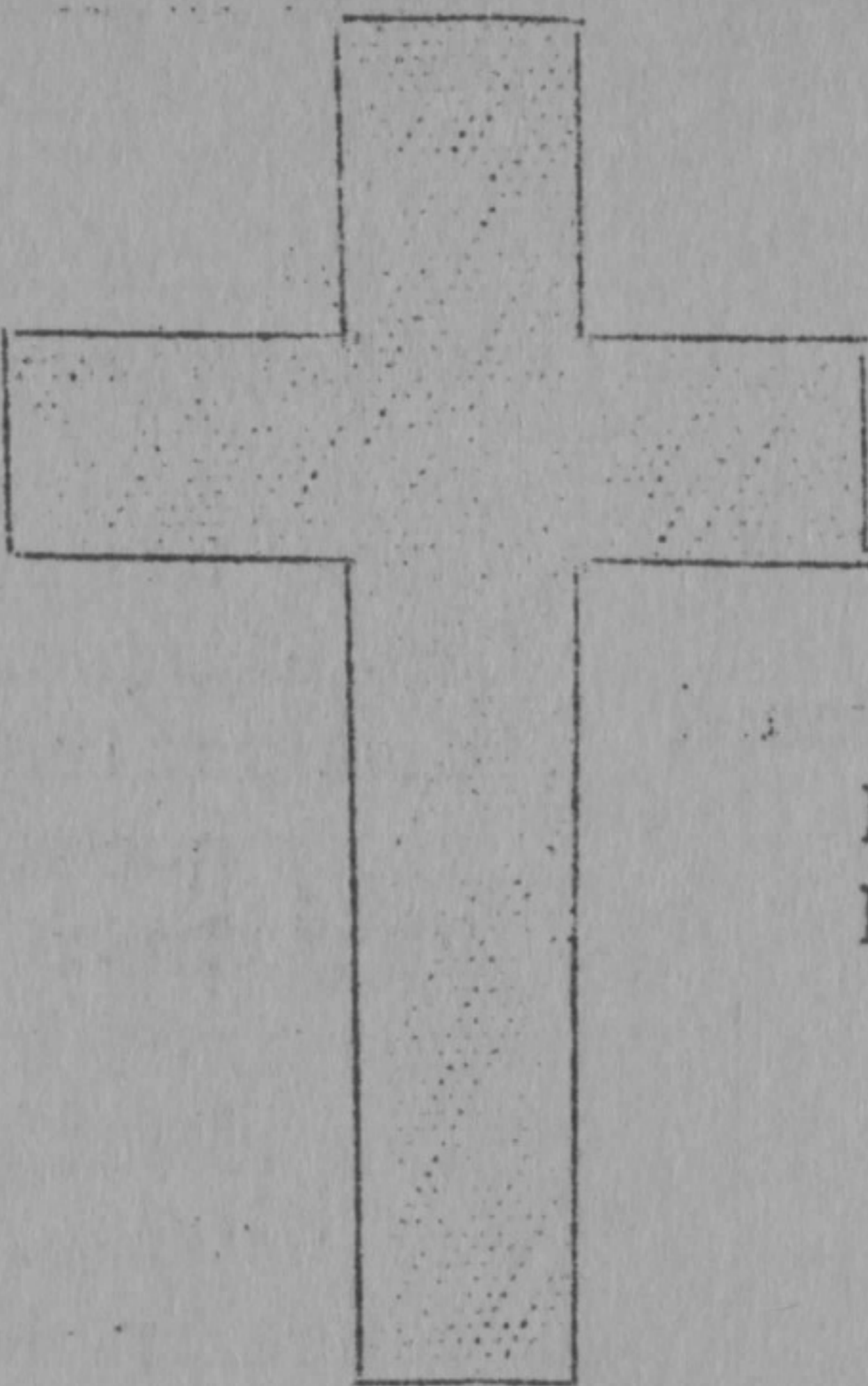
A Dram of Poison - Charlotte Armstrong
