MUNICIPAL ROAD WORK STARTED - \$84,000 APPROVED FOR ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Approval of the supplemental by-law for road construction for 1957 has just been received from the Minister of Highways. This by-law is for the expenditure of \$84,000 in addition to the \$16,000.00 already approved for normal maintenance of roads. It is intended to spend the \$84,000 this year to curb and pave the following: Simcoe Plaza from the highway to the Hudson Bay Store; Hudson Drive throughout; also to install curbing and prepare the base for paving on Selkirk Avenue and Pine Crescent. This is part of a road paving program extending over the next three years to complete the roads in the built-up areas of the whole community.

In the past few years money has been spent on the installation of storm sewers in preparation for the present paving program. Work has already started on the curbing on Simcoe Plaza. The contractor for this work is P. E. Boudreau and the road grading and paving will be done by Hewitson Construction Company.
