RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Baked Stuffed Tomatoes

Bake at 375° for 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 4 servings.

4 large firm tomatoes

- 1 small onion, chopped (‡ cup)
- l tablespoon butter or margarine

1 tsp. salt

½ tsp. marjoram

- 3 cups cooked rice (1 cup raw)
 - 4 tablespoons grated process Canadian Cheese.
- 1. Cut thin slice from stem end of tomatoes; cut out cores; save slices for Step 3; scoop out pulp, leaving shells about ‡ inch thick.
- 2. Saute onion in butter or margarine in medium-size saucepan just until tender; add tomato pulp, salt, and marjoram; simmer 5 minutes; stir in rice; heat just to boiling.
- 3. Spoon into tomato shells; sprinkle with cheese; replace top slices; place in shallow baking pan.
- 4. Bake in moderate over (375°F) 12 to 15 minutes, or just until tomatoes are tender.
