M.P.P.'S TO VISIT TERRACE BAY WEDNESDAY - AUGUST 28TH

Next Wednesday August 28th a party of fifty members of the Ontario Legislature will arrive in Terrace Bay in conjunction with their tour of Northwestern Ontario.

It is expected that the party will be headed up by Premier Leslie Frost. Other cabinet ministers expected are Minister of Lands and Forests Clare Mapledoram, and Mines Minister Spooner. They will be accompanied by a staff of civil servants, including representatives of lands and forests, mines and planning and development departments.

They will be guests of the LongLac Pulp and Paper Company at a luncheon at the Hotel Terrace. They will be taken on a tour of the town and the mill property.

Purpose of the tour is to acquaint the M.P.P.'s with the progress of development in Northern Ontario.

After leaving Terrace Bay the members will visit Sudbury, Blind River, Sault Ste. Marie, Marathon, Manitouwadge and North Bay. The group are scheduled to return to Toronto on September 1st.

We are fortunate in having this distinguished group of government representatives visit Terrace Bay on their tour. We trust that they will enjoy their visit, and that their tour of Northwestern Ontario will be rewarding and successful.

The party is due to arrive in Terrace Bay at 9:52 a.m. and depart at 2 p.m.
