



DON'T GIVE FIRE

There is much you can do to make reasonably sure that fire does not find a place to start in your home.

Fires are frequently spread by trash, rubbish or stored odds and ends that accumulate around the home. Closets, attics, and cellars are principal danger spots.

Periodically make a complete check-up from basement to attic and dispose of all old papers, rags, old clothing, broken furniture and debris. Don't keep unnecessary combustibles on which fire may feed.

Some materials (paint and certain types of oily rags, wiping cloths, mops, finely divided charcoal, are subject to spontaneous heating. Eliminate the conditions favorable for spontaneous combustion and you avoid fire from that source.
