

- ROAST VENISON -

Juice of 1 lemon	7 or 8 whole cloves
1 cup vinegar	1 tsp. sage
1 cup olive oil	Plenty of salt and pepper
1 chopped onion	

Cook together. Drain and cool. Meat should be wiped with clean, damp cloth and dry skin pulled off. Then marinate meat in above mixture until ready to cook (the longer the better). Then rub meat all over with $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. softened butter, dredge with flour, season with pepper and salt and place on rack of roasting pan. Hot oven (550) for 10 minutes. Then pour over meat 3 cups grape juice, stock or water, reduce temperature to 450 for 30 minutes, basting twice with liquid in pan. Then reduce temp. to 375 and cook for an hour (approx.) for 10 lb. leg roast, basting every 15 mins. Do not let liquid in pan evaporate. Finally add 1 jar grape jelly. Baste again with marinating liquid.
