LIBRARY REVIEW

The Gift and the Giver - Nelia Gardner White

In the beautiful setting of the New England countryside Miss White tells a story of a possessive, strong-willed woman's unwitting domination of those she loves. Cornelia Boone, the narrator, is writing down the story of her life from the time her scholarly husband, Walter left her after fourteen years of marriage, taking their four-year old daughter, Fanny, with him.

Their son, Philip, ten, stays with his mother. As she retraces the years of her overpowering devotion to Philip, of her efforts to cope with his often disturbing behaviour and her complete estrangement from Fanny and Walter until their dramatic reappearance, Cornelia comes to understand a little why things went as they did, and to realize her own limitations.
