Remembrance Day - Service & Dinner - Monday, November 11, 1957.

Remembrance Day 1957. - For the first time a Remembrance Day Service will be held in Terrace Bay at the newly erected community Cenotaph. There will be no parade as such for this first Remembrance Day. The committee responsible would like as many people there as possible, expecting the veterans to lead the way in attending the Service. It is expected that the mill shift workers who are not at work will turn out in good numbers. Veterans who can arrange to do so are asked to wear their medals.

The Guides, Brownies, Scouts & Cubs will be in attendance. The school principals will urge the children of the community to be in attendance, and of course everyone in town is invited.

The Service will commence at 10:45 a.m. and everyone is requested to report directly to the Cenotaph area: The program of Service is as follows: O Canada, Prayer, Last Post, Two Minutes Silence, Reveille, Laying of Wreaths, God Save the Queen.

Kimberly-Clark Obtains Contract with Irving Pulp Company of St. John, N.B.

Kimberly-Clark Corporation has contracted to sell the entire output of pulp from the Irving Pulp Company, St. John, N.B. As part of the agreement, Kimberly-Clark has agreed to supply certain management personnel.

Mr. J. C. Wig, formerly Mill Manager of Kimberly-Clark Pulp and Paper Company, Terrace Bay, Ontario, becomes Mill Manager of Irving Pulp Company effective November 1, 1957. Mr. Robert Shirriff replaces Mr. Wig as Mill Manager at Terrace Bay.

Mr. A. Fotvin, formerly Assistant Sulphite Superintendent of Spruce Falls Power and Paper Company, Kapuskasing, becomes Pulp Mill Superintendent of Irving Pulp Company, also effective November 1, 1957. Mr. George Arnold replaces Mr. Fotvin as Assistant Sulphite Superintendent at Kapuskasing.

The Irving Pulp Mill at the mouth of the St. John River in New Brunswick produces up to and better than 70,000 tons of bleached sulphite pulp per year.

This production was reached by the Irving Pulp Company after a recent 12 million dollar expansion program. Provision has been made for future installation of Kraft machinery and equipment.
