Afternoon at 3. Evening at 7.

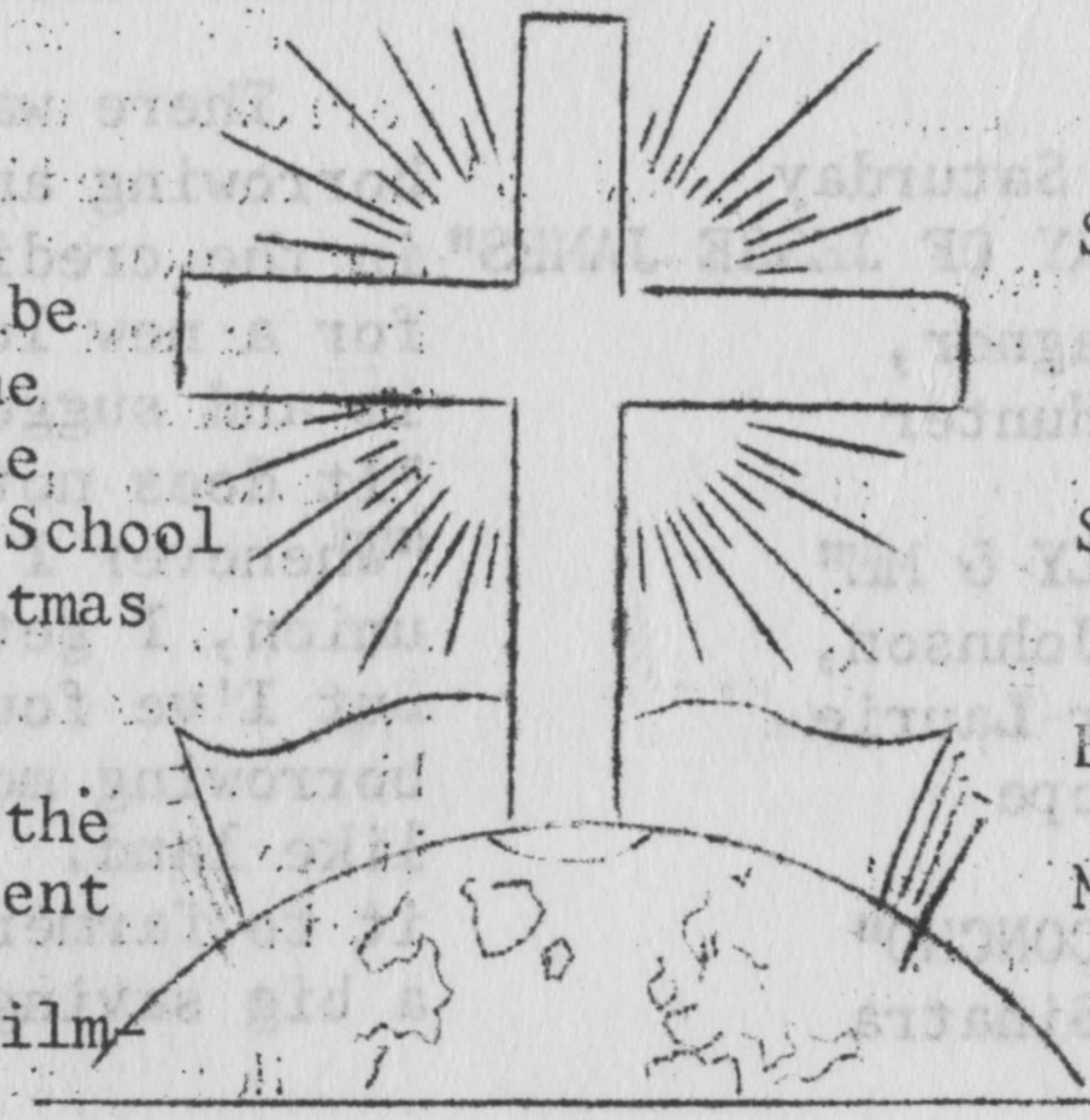
