"Is Another World Watching?"
"The Riddle of the Flying Saucers" - by
Gerald Heard.

Flying saucers and other aerial objects have been seen increasingly during the last few years by airline pilots, trained observers and the general public; there are some in fact who claim they have been observed for nearly two hundred years.
