MILL SETS NEW SAFETY RECORD FOR 1957.

Congratulations to every employee for having achieved the best safety record since mill start-up in 1948.

During 1957 we had two disabling injuries and worked a total of 1,318,830 man hours for a frequency rate of 1.52. This is a 50% improvement over our 1956 experience.

We had a time loss of seventeen days due to the disabling injuries for a severity rate of 12.89.

This new record represents a 30% improvement over our best previous record made in 1952 when we had three disabling injuries for a frequency rate of 2.15.

As injuries from accidents can be fatal or cause permanent or partial disability, we know that through our efforts to wipe out the unsafe acts and conditions we are eliminating the human suffering a disabling injury causes.

Let's continue to improve our safety record and set our objective for the coming year. "Eliminate disabling injuries in '58."
