LOLLIPOP COOKIES

- $\frac{1\frac{3}{4}}$  cups sifted enriched all-purpose flour
- $\frac{3}{4}$  teasp. baking soda
- 1 cup soft shortening
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cups brown sugar firmly packed,
- 1 teasp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teasp. cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teasp. powdered cloves
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sour milk or buttermilk
- 2 eggs, unbeaten
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cups uncooked rolled oats
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- Packaged plastic straws.

1. Wash your hands; put on apron; read recipe carefully. (Mother heats oven to 375°F.)
2. Get out Mother's mixing bowls, measuring cups, spoons, and all ingredients.
3. Sift about 2 cups flour into bowl. Now measure  $\frac{1\frac{3}{4}}$  cups back into sifter; add soda; sift onto piece of waxed paper.
4. Measure shortening and next 6 ingredients into big bowl. Beat well with spoon (or use Mother's electric mixer) till well mixed.
5. Stir in flour, oats, nuts. Drop teaspoonfuls, 2" apart, on greased cookie sheets.
6. Make faces with raisins, candied cherries, pitted dried prunes and dates, coconut.
7. Stick 4" length of plastic straw into each cookie, Bake 10 to 15 mins. Makes 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  dozen cookie-face lollipops.
