Superiors slumped against Marathon last Thursday and took a further set-back over the weekend when they played Red Rock Royals and came out on the short end of 7-6 of overtime play, Saturday night, and 8-5 Sunday.

However, they redeemed themselves Tuesday night when they stopped the Marathon Mercuries 7-5 with 10 minutes of overtime.

Marathon had been on a winning streak to the point of being Superior's main threat to top place in league standing. The way they came back in the third period to tie up the game proved that they meant business in taking first place from Superiors. Superiors in turn showed Marathon in the first and overtime periods that they have no intention of relinquishing their enviable position. As is usual in play between these two clubs the skating was fast, checking close and hard, each team quick to capitalize on any break that comes their way. Blom with Simoneau made good use of their breaks in the first period by getting the only two counters of the period at 12:40 and 15:59. At 16:15 Desrosiers and Tookenay both decided to rest with the officials. Marathon iced an all-offensive line but had every play nipped in the bud by Superiors star penalty-killers, Stachiw and Calder. Bouchard, at 0:06 of the second period further advanced Superiors before Marathon's Lanteigne with Cox shot one past Weaver at 0:42. Smith with Tookenay and Bouchard put Superiors up at 13:36 with Marathon retaliating at 18:10 - LeBlanc from Charyna and Bolan.

Marathon took the edge on offensive in the third period which paid off with 2 well-earned counters - LeBlanc from Amadeo at 4:46 and Henderson from Lanteigne and Cox at 6:51. Superiors were unable to score throughout the period.
