SUPERIORS DEFEAT "MERCS" 4 - 1

North Shore League-leaders, Marathon Mercuries were stopped short by the Terrace Bay Superiors at the Terrace Bay Arena Tuesday night. In a fast hard-checking game presenting tense moments at the nets of both teams and with each team largely and volubly supported the Superiors came out on top four to one. Smith from Whalen at 1:00 of play in the first period broke the egg for Superiors. From then and through the second period neither team could penetrate the opponents net. Marathon played Superiors about even for the first period but slipped in the second to allow the Superiors to shoot eight times at McMorland while they only gave Weaver three chances to beat them off. Smith at 5:20 of the third put the Superiors up another notch and had the Mercuries showing more than a little concern.

The break came for Marathon at 10:21. Tookenay and LeBlanc had weakened both teams by one player, at 9:52, Stachiw for Superiors took a tripping penalty. Marathon withdrew McMorland from the nets and had their gamble pay off at 10:36 when Cox shot home the goal that prevented a shutout by Superiors.

Marathon's bid for an equalizer was shattered by Simoneau at 11:31. Superiors offensive being the best defense kept pushing at the Marathon net for the remainder of the period. Marathon withdrew McMorland from the net but could not gain control of the play. Simoneau with seconds to go beat Marathon to a loose puck and added the final goal to the Superior total.
