# TERRACE BAY FISH & GAME ASSOCIATION

A well attended meeting was held at the "Lec." Centre on January 27th. As this was the annual meeting, President Ken MacLeod reported on club activities thru 1957, outlining the various projects that had been sponsored by the club. Major items were the programs for the junior members, a poster and essay contest in the local schools and restocking of local waters with 8000 legal sized trout,

A nominating committee, under the chairman, Mr. S. boyd, Sr. presented a slate of officers for the 1958 season and as a result of the ensuing election, the following officers were elected:

President: R. J. Hales, Vice. Fres. E. A. Fersson, Secretary: T. S. Hodgkiss, Treasurer: C. Lemay.

Considerable discussion was held in connection with the Hunter Training program being instituted this year by the Department of Lands & Forests. Latest information on this matter was presented to the meeting by Stan Hodgkiss who had recently returned from the annual convention of the Ontario Federation of Anglers & Hunters, held at Lingston. All members of the Terrace pay Club are also members of this Federation.

The prime purpose of the Hunter Training course is to train new hunter applicants in the use of firearms and the principles and interpretation of the Ontario Game & Fisheries act and regulations.

Certified instructors for this work will be drawn from the ranks of fish & game clubs across Ontario. Such instructors will be qualified thru the Department of Lands & Forests and authorized to conduct classes and award certificates of competence to those passing the course.

Fresent plans are that legislation will become effective in 1959 whereby this certificate of competence will be required by all new applicants for hunting licenses.

Several club members have indicated their desire to participate in this training program and the necessary applications will be made to the Department as it is felt that besides being a service to our community, participation in such a training program will be of value in training our young people in safe gun handling.

Attention Moose Hunters - If you have not yet made your return to the Department of Lands & Forests reporting on your moose hunt this last fall please do so promptly. This data is urgently required to complete the surveys on which seasons and limits are determined for next year.
