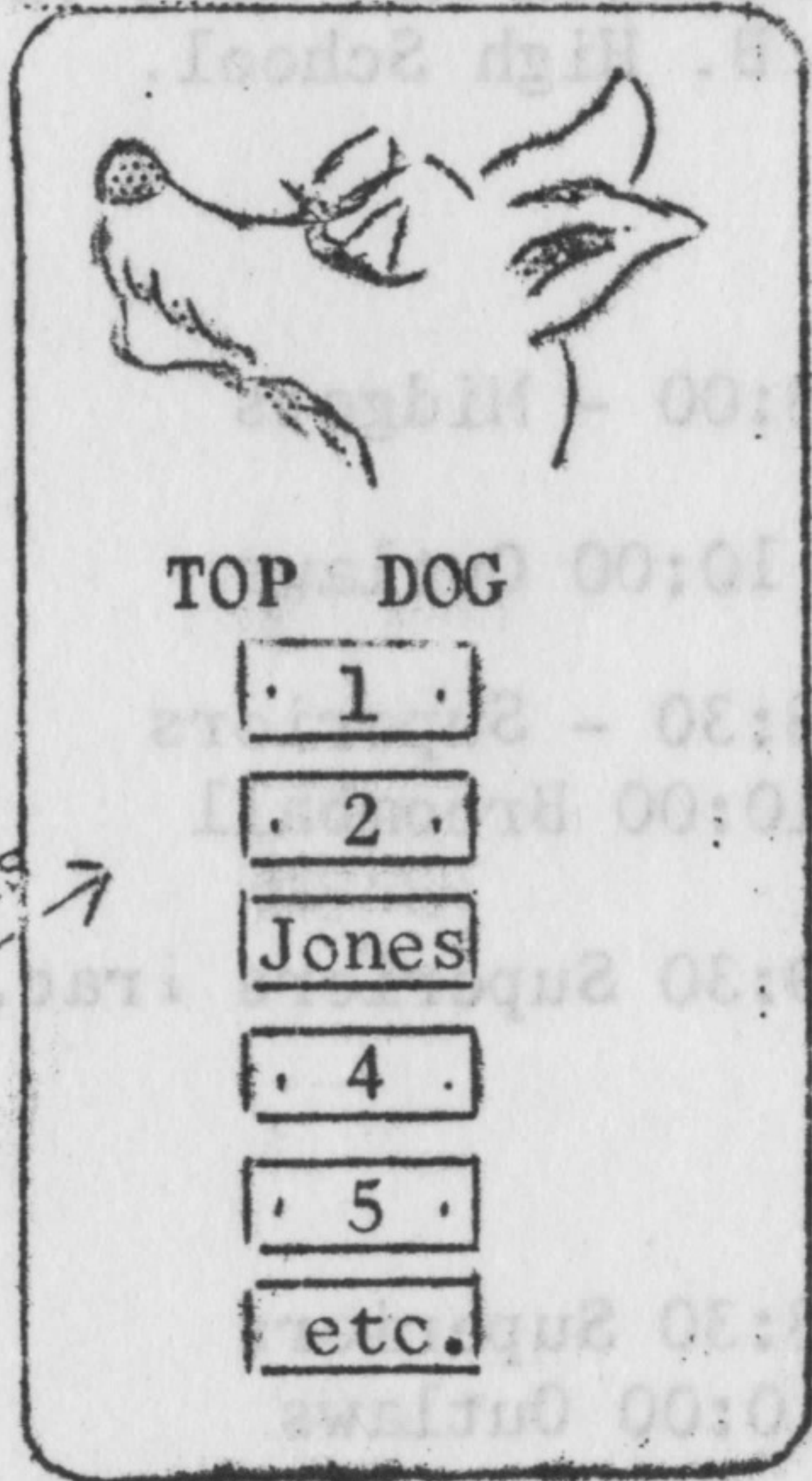


- CHALLENGE TROPHY -

Something new in curling in Terrace Bay will be tried beginning this weekend - a challenge trophy will be put up with prizes for the winners.



Rules will be as follows:

1. Challenge rinks will be made up of club-rated players or players advanced in rating and will be chosen by the skips. However, skips will not be allowed to use any players from their regular rinks and no challenge rink shall use more than two players from any one club rink except in cases of substitution. Rinks so chosen will

stand until the end of the season.

2. Skips will arrange and schedule their own games and should mark them on the draw sheet to be assured of ice time.

3. A rink may challenge either of the two rinks immediately above it on the board. Any rink that loses goes to the bottom of the board. The winner takes the place of the loser.

4. Rinks in 1st, 2nd and 3rd position must play at least one game (either a defence or a challenge) per calendar week, otherwise they will be moved to the bottom of the board. (Exception: #1 rink, if unchallenged)

5. Should two or more teams be defeated on the same draw or through default, they shall maintain the same relative positions at the bottom of the board.

6. Club rules will apply (including those re substitution).

7. A score card must be turned in for every game involving rinks in 1st, 2nd or 3rd position, to facilitate score-keeping and to ensure that they play at least one game in each calendar week. These cards must be marked "Challenge Trophy," be clearly dated and signed by both thirds.

8. Starting position on the board will be determined by drawing rinks from "the hat."

9. The trophy will go to the rink that defends the 'top dog' position successfully the most times. Presentation will be made at the annual windup.

Please note that any club member may skip a rink -- you can move up but not down in rating.

Enter your rink as soon as possible -- the draw for position will take place at 11 a.m. Saturday, February 15th in the curling rink. Play may begin anytime after that. Any rink entered after this date will start at the bottom of the board.

Individual entries will be accepted and an effort to place them on a team will be made.

This competition is meant to be supplementary and is not intended to interfere in any way with the regular club curling.
