

STUFFED POTATO PUFFS - 4 servings

4 baked large potatoes

1 cup grated raw carrot

4 small green onions, finely chopped

l teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper

1 cup (8-ounce container) dairy sour cream

Paprika.

- 1. Halve potatoes; scoop out centres into large bowl; mash with fork.
- 2. Stir in carrot, onions, salt, pepper, and sour cream; beat with fork to blend well.
- 3. Spoon into shells; sprinkle with paprika.
- 4. Heat in hot oven (400) 20 minutes.
