### SNOWBALL FUDGE

- 1 2/3 cups sugar
- 1 small can evaporated milk
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 package (about 6 ozs.) tiny marshmallows
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Blend sugar, evaporated milk and salt in medium-size saucepan; heat to boiling; boil 5 minutes, stirring constantly, remove from heat.

Stir in half the marshmallows (about 1 1/2 cups) chocolate and vanilla; stir until melted and blended.

Pour into buttered square pan 8x8x2; sprinkle remaining marshmallows and walnuts on top, swirl lightly into candy; chill.

Cut into squares when firm.

The Lakehead papers publicized the Festival and a timely quote from the Editorial in Monday's Times-Journal is herewith reprinted:

"One of the several highlights of this year's Festival was the participation of ladies' choirs from Terrace Bay and Atikokan. The adjudicator bowed his head in the direction of Atikokan, but he had warm words of praise for the ladies from Terrace Bay at the same time.

Behind the thrill felt by the audience in Selkirk High School where the two choirs sang was the realization that so much came from two municipalities which are so young in terms of Canadian history. There was no Terrace Bay in 1945 - northing there but virgin bush. In 1945 Atikokan had not been awakened from a small village status to a thriving iron-mining town.

Yet from the groups which have pioneered in the two communities - in the short space of 13 years - came two choral organizations that can compare favourably with similar organizations from any municipality in Canada."
